Four talented Orchestra Lumos musicians will be joined by award-winning global concert pianist, Tanya Bannister, to perform to a new audience in Darien, CT. This carefully curated program features pieces by two of classical music's prodigies, W.A. Mozart and Amy Beach. Beach was one of the first female composers to be recognized nationally in the United States in the nineteenth century. Her groundbreaking Symphony in E minor was premiered by the Boston Symphony Orchestra in 1896. "We were delighted to be approached by one of our devoted audience members to suggest the Mozart Piano Concerto No.14, played by a quintet, for a *Small Space* concert in the 2025-2026 season. It took one phone call to secure the services of the actual pianist performing on the CD that accompanied the

request, our neighbor Tanya Bannister from New York. With our musicians and this *America* 250 program we are pleased to be bringing a *Small Space* concert to Darien for the very first time and so delighted to be partnering with the Darien Arts Center." **Said Russell Jones, the Susanah and Naeem Fayyaz President and CEO of Orchestra Lumos**.

Celebrated by *The Washington Post* for performances that exhibit intelligence, poetic expression, and refined balance, Tanya Bannister is a distinguished arts leader, uniquely blending artistic mastery with entrepreneurial insight in her role as President of Concert Artists Guild (CAG), the prominent organization that sponsors young musicians, and has helped launch dozens of global stars. "I'm really excited to perform with Orchestra Lumos.
